At the February 2020 TDTD general membership meeting, we celebrated Black Golf History. Three Juniors—Kourey Patterson, Kyla Coaxum and Mahamed Ibrahim—were selected to provide presentations on different historical Black golf figures.

The Juniors did an excellent job and the adult TDTD members enjoyed the presentations. One of our TDTD Junior Golf goals was met, as our club continues to provide a Bridge from the Past to the Present to the Future of golf in the Black community.

Learn more about Black Golf History

African Americans have a long, storied history in golf as champions, golf club and course designers, and clubhouse owners.

African-American George F. Grant invented the golf tee in 1899. Grant was a dentist by trade, and he took up golf after the Civil War. John J. Shippen, Jr., believed to be the first Black golf pro, was an early golfing pioneer who played in the second U.S. Open in 1897 at age 18. Joe Bartholomew, who grew up in New Orleans, entered the caddie ranks by age seven in 1887. He became an exceptional player, attended college in New York to study golf course architecture, and eventually returned home to ply his trade. He designed several courses in New Orleans, but because Bartholomew was Black, many members of the courses refused to let him play what he had designed. *Excerpt from <u>History of Golf Part Eight—African Americans and Golf</u>. The Golf Channel 2012.*

Beyond individual players, African Americans invested in golf clubhouses and resorts for Black golfers. The oldest Black-owned golf clubhouse in the U.S. is the Shady Rest Golf & Country Club in New Jersey, founded in 1921 by prominent Black investors. Shady Rest was the home of early golf pro John J. Shippen Jr. Famous celebrities such as W.E.B. DuBois, Count Basie, Billie Holiday, and many others were among its guests. Shady Rest is now the Scotch Hills Country Club, which has preserved the Shady Rest Clubhouse on its nine-hole golf course.
