- 5. Seventeen members and their families traveled to New Orleans in May for our first club trip since before the pandemic. (goal 1)
- 6. In July, 50 + members and friends gathered at the theater to see "Tina" as one of our Friends and Family events. (goal 1)
- 7. In July, we had the second of our in-person meetings at Chester Washington with recognitions, introductions, viewing of videos, and dancing. (goal 1)
- 8. Assisted in graduating over 40 new golfers from the Women in Golf program in August. (goal 1,3)
- 9. Twenty + women traveled by bus to Vallejo in September to defend the North/ South Shootout trophy.
- 10. The Off-Season Program kicked off in October under the new leadership of Dee Dee Carter. (goal 1 and 2)
- 11. Increased membership from 87 to 111. (goal 3)

As we say goodbye to 2023, I pray that God will continue to shine on the Tee Divas & Tee Dudes Golf Club as we make an impact in the golf community.

#### **MAGGIE HATHAWAY RENOVATION MOVING FORWARD – AGREEMENT SIGNED IN NOV**

When the 123rd U.S. Open Championship came to Los Angeles in June for the first time since 1948, the United States Golf Association (USGA) brought a significant investment in the host community as it does in every City hosting the event.



This year, it chose to invest in renovating Maggie Hathaway Golf Course in South Los Angeles. A collection of foundations formed a funding collaborative around the initiative to establish a \$15 million fund--<u>FORE Youth: 2023 U.S. Open Community Legacy Campaign</u> overseen by the Southern California Golf Association (SCGA) to support the endeavor. The Southern California Golf Association announced the news on their website that the project agreement has been signed:

"The Los Angeles County Department of Parks & Recreation, American Golf and the Fore Youth Golf Foundation signed an agreement Thursday to officially commence the Maggie Hathaway GC renovation project. The Foundation is the newly established non-profit supporting renovation, maintenance, and impactful junior programming at Maggie Hathaway GC. The Fore Youth: 2023 U.S. Open Community Legacy campaign, led by the SCGA, USGA, and The Los Angeles Country Club (LACC), has raised \$8M for the renovation project to create a community legacy benefiting underserved and underrepresented youth." <u>https://www.scgajunior.org/news/agreement-signed-to-initiate-maggie-hathaway-project/</u>

A launching event was held at Maggie Hathaway Golf Course on June 11 with USGA and SCGA officials following the formal announcement from <u>Los County</u> <u>Board of Supervisors Holly Mitchell 2<sup>nd</sup></u> <u>District</u>, and other officials, including Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass and California State 35<sup>th</sup> District Senator Steven Bradford. Officials and members of the Western States Golf Association (WSGA), including Tee Divas & Tee Dudes Golf Club, one of several WSGA member clubs, were in attendance. The youth came out to golf and received golf equipment from the organizers.

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Black Golf History & Junior Achievement Event Sunday, February 4, 2024

The TDTD Black Golf History and Junior Achievement Award event will be our 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Event. TDTD Juniors will present the **Significant Moment in Black Golf History on Pioneer Black golfer Charlie Sifford.** 

In 1961, Charlie Sifford, famous for his statement **"Just Let Me Play,"** became the first Black man allowed to join the Professional Golf Association after the \*Caucasian Only" clause was removed from their membership By-laws. What was unknown by many in the golf community was that Charlie's battle with the PGA began in California. During the event, our TDTD Juniors will present Charlie Sifford's Significant Moment in Black Golf History.

TDTD Juniors will also present the **Doris LaCour Leadership Award to the SCGA Junior Foundation.** As a major partner to the TDTD Golf Club, the Foundation consistently supported our Juniors by offering College scholarships and campus tours. They also provide playing opportunities at Golf Country Clubs across Los Angeles County with reduced rates for group and on-course lessons, opportunities for our TDTD girls' participation in the LPGA Girls Golf Southwest Chapter, financial support for participation in the Mack Champ Invitational, and other support. Most recently, the SCGA Junior Foundation led efforts to revitalize our community

golf course with the **Maggie Hathaway Project**. The project will be a game-changer for our juniors, women's golf clubs, and the entire South Los Angeles golfing community.
